Founded in 1975, the mission NWRA is to conserve America's wildlife for future generations through programs that protect, enhance and expand the National Wildlife Refuge System and the landscapes beyond its boundaries. NWRA vigilantly advocates against government policies and legislation that undermine the integrity of the Refuge System, while promoting those that advance wildlife conservation. The NWRA addresses Refuge System funding, management, and strategic growth, while also supporting other programs, including outreach to Refuge Friends groups, and other partners nationwide, that maximize the system's conservation impact.

The first national wildlife refuge, Pelican Island NWR (5 acres), was established by Theodore Roosevelt in 1903 and has grown to 568 national wildlife refuges totaling 850 million acres of lands and waters (marine monuments).

Not just for wildlife, these lands are also for wildlife dependent, compatible recreation.

Dear < Friend of Family's name >,

We all know the importance of public lands. From coast to coast, south to Puerto Rico, north to Alaska, and out into the Atlantic and Pacific marine national monuments, the National Wildlife Refuge System provides open lands and waters to enjoy. Especially now, wildlife refuges are providing space for people to go explore outdoors, enjoy fresh air, and connect – or reconnect – with nature. Some refuges have been busier than ever! Hundreds of Friends Group volunteers are finding ways to support their local refuges and help provide visitation practices compatible with COVID-19 safety precautions.

We have seen some amazing legislative advances for the Refuge System in recent months. The passage of the Great American Outdoors Act provides full and dedicated funds for the Land Water Conservation Fund and provides up to \$95 million each year to the Refuge System to tackle the \$1.4 billion maintenance backlog. The House of Representative's FY2021 Interior Appropriations Bill includes an \$8 million increase for the Refuge System Operations and Maintenance budget.

Yet at the same time, vitally important individual national wildlife refuges around this country are under attack. The Northeast Canyons and Seamounts Marine National Monument, the only marine national monument in the Atlantic Ocean, was reopened for commercial fishing this summer. Alaska's Arctic National Wildlife Refuge has been opened to oil and gas development and we are awaiting a lease sale. In San Bernardino National Wildlife Refuge in Arizona, water is being drawn from refuge aquifers to make concrete for the border wall that's disrupting protected habitat for threatened and endangered species. Barbaric wildlife-killing methods newly allowed at Kenai National Wildlife Refuge in Alaska mock the practice of ethical hunting.

Throughout all these challenges, the National Wildlife Refuge Association continues fighting every day to protect, promote, and enhance the National Wildlife Refuge System. As public lands are becoming more popular, we need to ensure that the Refuge System receives adequate funding. Right now, Friends Groups and volunteers help fill some of the gaps, but they aren't able to fill all of them.

I know that everyone is right now facing challenging and difficult circumstances. Perhaps you can support the Refuge System by staying informed about refuge issues and contacting decision makers through the National Wildlife Refuge Association's Action Alerts or by volunteering with a local Friends group. 
